Principals' Messages

Suzanna Davis

- Outstanding start to year; Matt is making a great impact on district taking the time to listen and learn about us; no lack of motivation and inspiration, he asks "how can we be the best?"
- Class of 2018 is the first graduating class using the air test points. There has been an outcry across the state regarding too many students who won't graduate this year due to change. Legislature came out with one year extension of eased requirements to help students graduate.
- How do we make staff, parents and students integrate and be excited about our partnership? We are continuing extensive staff training; 23 students on student advisory council (Rich Bryant leads). It's a powerful concept; going to roll out to student body (voluntary). How to introduce to parents?
- Social media uptick – We've asked teachers – how do you see yourself and your image in the classroom and on social media? How do parents see you, students? We are playing music in hallways. During the opening days, students did twitter session for staff and will now do for the community (Sunday at 2:00 and next Tuesday at 7:00) in the professional digital learning center (off cafeteria, straight ahead)
- Changes in Ohio legislature attendance – no delineation between excused and unexcused absences; waiting on our policy company to get them to us for approval; districts w/95% attendance don't have to worry about this and we were at 94.6% attendance. We have no way to do bell by bell attendance so it's based on the first period attendance.
- Sophomore and freshman orientation went great! Our link leaders sat down with Suzanna in July with ideas to make it better and they implemented them all! Students talking to students versus adults not speaking to students.
- Football game Friday – 210 people signed up to come from staff; elementary students coming out for future hawk night – 16 minute Rozzi fireworks set to music - lots of buzz in community
- We are now 3rd largest high school in state – Mason first followed by Centerville.

Rob Burnside

- He was a student and football player here 20 years ago when East became East!
- PTSO purchased T-shirts for Freshman campus opening day, wanted them to feel like a high school student. Worked on easing tension, building relationships and their culture. Guest speaker, Nick Jackson's message was "we need everybody to make this year successful". Final chant "We Are One", panoramic photo of all freshman wearing the shirt.
- PTSO purchased Keurig connected to water line for staff. Staff supplies their own K cups. It was greatly appreciated.
